

# 2009 Fall Family Camp Information - Pack 29

**Dates:** Friday, October 23 - Sunday, October 25, 2009

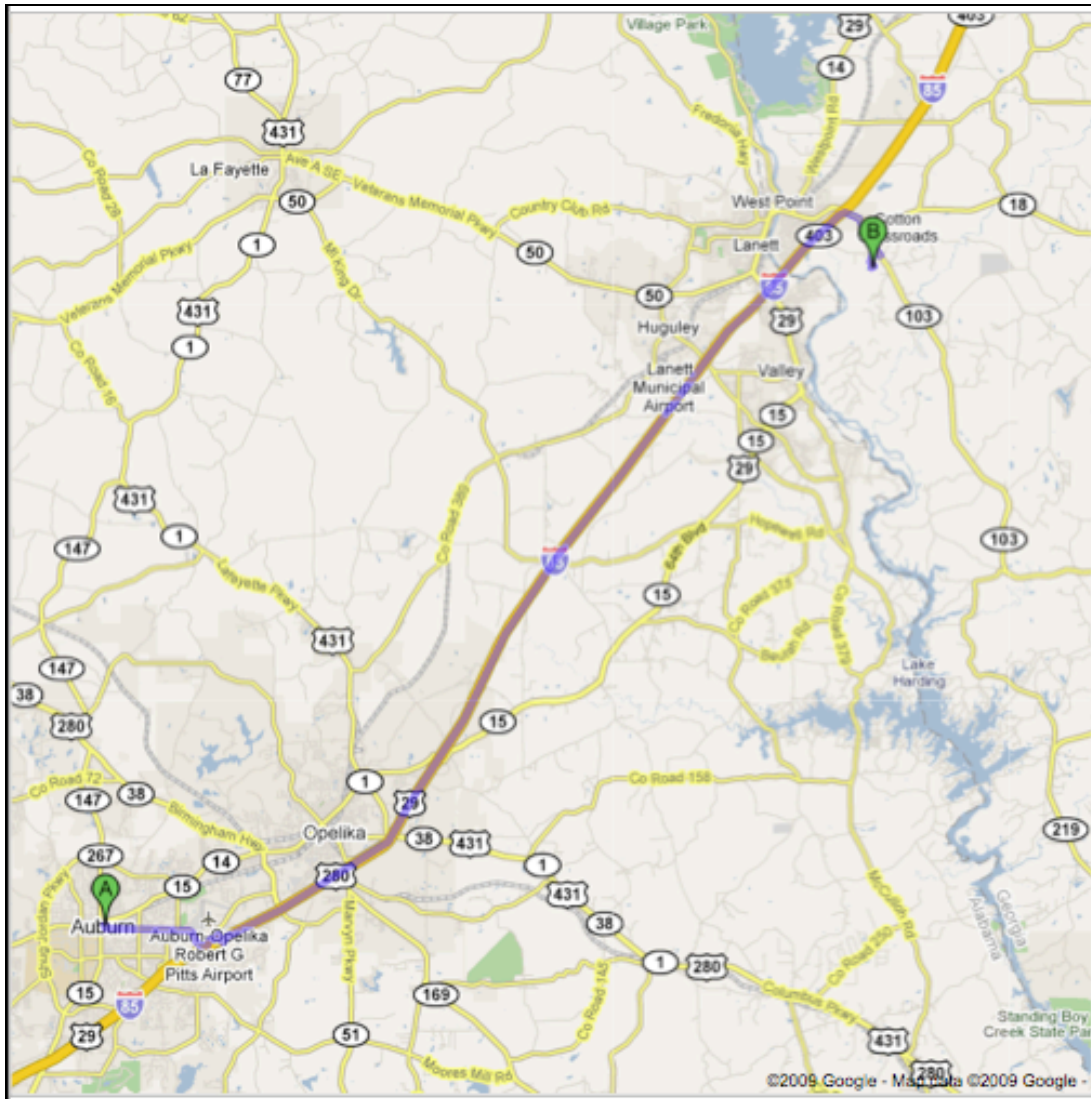
**Location:** **Camp Pine Mountain at West Point, GA**  
Camp Pine Mountain 565 Boy Scout Rd West Point, GA 31833

Located a few miles southeast of West Point, Georgia

**Estimated Distance from Auburn:** 31 miles **Estimated travel time:** 40 minutes

**About Camp Pine Mtn:** Situated on 35 acres and established in 1923, Camp Pine Mountain has a rich heritage of supporting scouting. With cabins named after area communities, facilities include cabins with bunks, shower house, a large activity field, a covered pavilion, multiple picnic tables, a chapel campfire area, potable water, flushing latrines, fishing, canoeing, archery range and bb rifle range. The camp has hosted Fall Family camps involving over 400 scouts and adults.

**Directions to Camp:** On the way up:  
Take Interstate 85 North towards Atlanta. Take Exit 2 (GA Hwy 18, West Point/Pine Mountain). At the stop sign turn right and travel east on GA Hwy 18 approximately one half mile. Turn right on GA Hwy 103 (first road to the right). Go approximately one mile and turn right onto old West Point Road (this is the first paved road to your right). As you start down the hill, turn into the first driveway on your left. This is the entrance to Camp Pine Mountain.



## **General Information:**

Pack 29 will be assigned a campsite on Friday evening when the first campers arrive. Upon arrival, you should ask a camp ranger or volunteer where Pack 29 is camping or you can call us (contact numbers on next page). You may not be able to drive to the site if you arrive on Saturday because the camp staff will be trying to keep the traffic around camp to a minimum. There will be volunteers available with a trailer to take your gear to camp. Saturday morning will be very busy, so be prepared for a little chaos. You can always bring your gear to camp later in the day. The site should have water and a bathroom facility with showers will be nearby. There will not be electricity at the campsite.

There are no grills or fire pits on site. We must bring our own grills, cook stoves or raised fire pit with charcoal or wood to cook on. The Pack will be providing these items, but we could always use some firewood.

The rangers will be available to check in 'early birds' on Friday night. Check-in on Saturday between 8:00-9:00 am (EST). Activities begin at 9:30 am Saturday.

All activities will occur on Saturday. During the day, Archery, BB Gun Shooting, Fishing, Field Games, and Crafts will be done (if you wish) according to a rotating schedule (detailed below). On Saturday evening, there will be a Haunted House, Hay Ride, Rain Gutter Regatta, Carnival, Costume Parade and a Movie. Of course, we'll have the Auburn-LSU game on the radio at camp as well.

Check out on Sunday is by 9 am.

The general store on-site sells a few snacks and t-shirts. Plan to bring everything you need because a decent size store won't be convenient! Family Camp T-shirts are available for sale at camp for \$10 and exact change is appreciated.

All of the meals will be provided by the Pack. There may be some snacks provided by the pack as well, but it wouldn't be a bad idea to bring a few that you like as well.

## **Activity Details:**

Archery - Scouts will be assisted by a group of boy scouts and certified instructors in shooting bows and arrows at targets. The bows and arrows are just the right size for a cub scout. Be sure to follow the range safety rules.

BB Gun Shooting - Scouts will be assisted by a group of boy scouts and certified instructors in shooting BB guns at targets. Be sure to follow the range safety rules.

Fishing - Any camper may fish throughout the campout, but they must bring their own equipment. Adult supervision is required for this activity.

Field Games - The Field Games will include an obstacle course, pumpkin catapult, and possibly some other activities.

Crafts - The craft for this year's camp will be to build boats for the raingutter regatta and we'll race during the evening. These boats will be made of more than aluminum foil and you'll have more than 10 minutes to build them.

Haunted House - An age appropriate haunted house is available for those who wish to chance it!

Hay Ride - An age appropriate haunted house is available for those who wish to chance it!

Raingutter Regatta - The race will be an open race held within our Pack and perhaps some other scouts. This is not a formal race, but a fun race.

Carnival - There will be a typical carnival in the activity building with games, prizes, etc.

Costume Parade - The parade will begin at the bathhouse and end at the Dining Hall. There will be secret judges throughout the parade route to determine winners of the costume contest.

Movie - An age appropriate movie will be shown after the carnival and popcorn will be provided.
